Fascinating Finds

Back in 1993, I dropped by a local coin shop to search through the box of 'junk' silver. Back then, silver was selling for about four dollars per dollar face. This particular day, there were a lot of mercury dimes. Taking my time, I started checking all the dates and mint marks.

I soon came across a 1916. I flipped it over assuming it to be a 'P' mint. Much to my surprise, it was a 'D' mint. I looked again and rubbed it, then rubbed my eyes and looked again. It was indeed a 1916-D.

I purchased that dime along with some others. The purchase price was .40 cents. The coin came home. It then went on to Teddy Roosevelt Numismatics (now Texican Coin and Bullion). Doc sent it to PCGS to make sure of its authenticity. It came back XF40.

I sold it to Doc about a month or so after it was encapsulated. I used the money as a down payment on the purchase of my first home.

Some new items have recently been released from the United States Mint. The new Presidential Dollar proof set, the Little Rock commemorative, the new First Spouse gold coins, and 'W' mint American eagles to name just a few.

On May 15th, the United States Mint commemorated the 50th anniversary of the desegregation of Little Rock Central High School with an uncirculated and proof silver dollar. The obverse portrays the feet of students being escorted by a United States soldier below a row of nine stars symbolizing the Little Rock Nine.

The United States Mint kicked off the First Spouse Gold Coin Program on June 19th with the release of the Martha Washington and Abigail Adams one-half ounce \$10 gold proof and gold uncirculated coins.
