Coins in the News

The 2007 State Quarter Proof sets were released from the United States Mint on January 23rd. They are available in the clad versions as well as silver.



The 400th anniversary of Jamestown commemorative coins were also released from the mint in proof and uncirculated issues in both silver and gold.



The first of four of the new Presidential dollars were released of February 15th. They are being issued in addition to the Sacagawea dollars. These have the edge lettering incused into the 3rd die known as the collar.



The date, mint mark, and motto are incused. Error coins are confirmed on the edge lettering. The most talked about are the ones with no edge lettering. Prices have gone as high as \$612.00 for this error.
